BC FERRIES THANKS MALAHAT NATION FOR ARTWORK AT MILL BAY TERMINAL

Local community steps up to beautify terminal

VICTORIA – BC Ferries is proud to display new Indigenous artwork at its Mill Bay terminal. Following a small fire that damaged an outdoor enclosure at the terminal last spring, BC Ferries worked with Malahat Nation to refresh the property and is pleased to showcase the results with new artwork from the local community.

Jeremy and Jordan Harry of Malahat Nation created artwork on two panels displayed on the terminal's wooden enclosure. The first design depicts a rendering of two killer whales breaching as they hunt for salmon with the moon above. The second design is the symbol of Malahat Nation with mountains, the sun and a canoe, representing water people. Together, the panels display earth, sky and life.

“The artwork of Malahat Nation is a wonderful addition to our Mill Bay terminal,” said Mark Wilson, Vice President of Strategy & Community Engagement at BC Ferries. “The designs of Jeremy and Jordan Harry are striking. They have captured many beautiful elements of the local area in which we operate.”

“We are proud to showcase our artwork at the Mill Bay terminal,” said artist Jordan Harry. “Our design is a representation of our community and we are pleased to share it with BC Ferries and the many travellers that pass through the terminal.”
