

An Update on BC Ferries' Langdale Terminal Redevelopment Plan

Hello Sunshine Coast Residents,

Great news, we are getting ready to hold our next round of engagement for the Langdale terminal development project this September. Engagement will include events at the terminal and on board the vessels (please see the schedule below). We will take this opportunity to focus on the overhead walkway project in particular, and provide information on the design. We'll also provide you with an update on the upland redevelopment portion of the project at this time. We look forward to having these important conversations with you.

Overhead Walkway Project

We continue to make progress with the design and implementation of the overhead pedestrian walkway. The project is moving through the approvals process with our Board of Directors, and we will submit our application to the BC Ferries Commissioner for his approval later this fall.

This application is part of the standard approvals process for all our major projects, and provides a rigorous review of all major capital expenditures by our external governing body.

Upland Redevelopment Project

As a reminder, we split the upland redevelopment project from the walkway project over the summer. This allows us to move ahead with critical pedestrian walkway improvements, while we continue work on the terminal building design. The uplands project looks at the terminal building and the terminal access road, the pick-up and drop-off areas, and parking areas at the terminal.

Progress continues on this portion of the project, with the ongoing development of an alternate terminal building concept. This alternate concept looks at how to achieve cost savings by considering, where appropriate, minor upgrades to existing terminal assets, and phasing in a less expansive new terminal building. Expect more engagement on the upland redevelopment project in 2019.
