**Re: Request under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act***

British Columbia Ferry Services Inc. (BC Ferries) received your request for access to records under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (the FOIPP Act) on January 14, 2019. Your request was as follows:

*A copy of the winning bid to: RFP# 06-01-2018 Time Collection and Crew Scheduling Software Selection.*

The record responsive to your request was sent in a consultation to a third party. Further to our letter of April 12, 2019, the third party had 20 business days to apply for a review of our decision regarding disclosure of the record. As the third party did not apply for a review, attached please find a copy of the record responsive to your request.

The record contains information excepted from disclosure under the FOIPP Act. This information was severed so the remaining information could be disclosed. We have noted on the record which section of the FOIPP Act was relied on to sever the information.

Under section 21 of the FOIPP Act, we must refuse to disclose financial or similar information of or about a third party, supplied in confidence, whose disclosure could reasonably be expected to: harm the competitive position or interfere significantly with the negotiating position of the third party; result in similar information no longer being supplied to BC Ferries; or, result in undue financial loss or gain to any person or organization. We have also withheld the same information under section 17, as its disclosure could reasonably be expected to harm the financial interests of BC Ferries.

We have withheld information under section 15 of the FOIPP Act, where disclosure could reasonably be expected to harm the security of our communications or computer systems.

Finally, we have removed personal information under section 22 whose disclosure would be an unreasonable invasion of third parties' personal privacy.

Thank you for your deposit of \$26.13 for this request, received on February 19, 2019. The final charge for this request is \$23.83. We have calculated this amount, using our commercial applicant rate, as follows:
